

Search Tips and Tricks

1. To search for an exact phrase, enclose the phrase in quotes:
`"confidentiality agreement"`
2. By default, MetaJure searches for records having all of your key words. To search for alternative terms, use **OR** between them:
`negligence OR malfeasance`
3. To group search terms, use parentheses:
`(confidentiality agreement) OR (non-disclosure agreement)`
4. To exclude results containing a given word, use **NOT** before the desired word:
`mortgage NOT balloon`
5. To search for multiple words within a given distance of each other, use the `~` symbol with the desired word range:
`"confidentiality agreement"~5`
6. To search using a wild card, use the `*` symbol:
`indemni*` (finds indemnify, indemnification, indemnity, indemnities, etc.)
7. To run a "fuzzy" search, use the `~` symbol:
`binnay~` (finds "binnay", "binney", "biney", "bennay", etc.)
8. To search for words in a document's title or in an email's subject line:
`documentTitle:indemnity`
9. To limit a search to folders with a given name:
`documentLocation:(john jones)`
10. To search for documents by a given author (or emails from a given sender):
`Author:(kevin harrang)`
11. You can also combine any of the above tools to fit your search requirements:
`documentTitle:((confidentiality agreement) OR (non-disclosure agreement))
documentLocation:forms Author:(kevin harrang)`
12. Capitalization matters only for **OR**, **NOT** and **AND**, as well as the initial capitalization of the "T" in "documentTitle:" as well "L" in "documentLocation:" and "A" in "Author:"
